 (Both are standard diplomas)
- Have a cumulative GPA of 2.000
- Pass the FSA and/or EOC exam
 - Reading (Grade 10 FSA ELA)
 - Math (Algebra I EOC)

18 Credit Plan Academically Challenging Curriculum to Enhance Learning (ACCEL)

- All other graduation requirements for a 24-credit standard diploma must be met (per section 1003.4282(3)-(e), Florida Statute[F.S.]).
- Only 3 electives are required, instead of 8.
- No HOPE/PE credit is required.
- No online course is required.

- are NOT rounded to the nearest tenth place!

ZHS ReTake Policy

- Students may retake summative assessments two times
- The highest score earned on the retakes will be issued
- Students have up to two weeks to complete remediation and all retakes
- No retakes are allowed the last week of the quarter unless approved by the teacher
- No retakes may be attempted if the student has missing work
- Teacher assigned remediation must be completed prior to retake attempt

Electronics Use Policy

Florida Academic Scholars

- 100% of tuition and applicable fees and \$300 for both fall and spring semesters
- SAT 1330 (reading/math) or ACT 29
 (Reading & Math only) (out of 36 ACT)
- 3.5 weighted GPA in core academic courses
- Need 100 hours of Community Service Hours

Florida Medallion Scholars

Pays 75% of tuition and applicable fees

■ SAT 1210 or ACT 25

■ 3.0 GPA in core academic courses

□ 75 Community Service hours

Gold Seal Vocational Scholars

- Pays a flat rate per credit hour. (up to \$48)
- SAT: Reading 24 Writing 25 Math 24
- ACT: English 17 Reading 19 Math 19
- PERT: Reading 106 Writing 103 Math 114
- Need 3.0 in core academic courses
- Need 3.5 in 3 sequential and approved vocational courses
- 30 Community Service hours

Other Bright Futures Requirements

- Florida High School Graduate
- Must successfully complete 2 years of a foreign language
- Not guilty of a felony
- Use Award within 2 years of graduation
- Attend a Florida College or University (Public or Private)
- Must complete a Florida Student Financial Aid Application(FFAA) no later than Aug. 31st of your graduation year.
