Principal's Message

It's hard to believe the end of Semester 1 is nearly here! As we begin the holiday season, remember to cherish your loved ones and create new memories or traditions. We have so much to celebrate! Great things are happening at Zephyrhills High School and our students demonstrate Bulldog PRIDE (Proud, Respectful, Individual Thinker, Dedicated to Academics, and Engaged) every day!

Academics: Our Bulldogs are moving in to second semester. Our grade level triad (Assistant Principal, School Counselor, and Graduation Enhancement Coach) meets weekly to review your student's progress. In January, we will continue to offer after school tutoring and opportunities for students to recover graduation credits. In February, we will begin course selection for the 20-21 school year.

<u>Athletics:</u> Our Girls Weightlifting team has set several personal records and has started off the season strong! Basketball and Soccer seasons are underway for Boys and Girls Junior Varsity and Varsity, and we are holding our own in league competition. Our Cheer squad competed at UCA Florida Regionals and at Springstead High School. Wrestling season is underway and the athletes have represented us well in tournaments!

<u>Activities:</u> Our Army JROTC has been busy in our community with Raider competitions, Drill Meets, Community Service, and ceremonial celebrations. 

Driver Ed

Spring Session 2020

After-School Driving instruction will be offered at ZHS beginning February 2020. This course is ideal for students with the following circumstances:

- · Cannot fit Driver Ed into their day school schedule
- Attend a surrounding high school that does not offer Driver Ed
- Simply need more driving practice & instruction before taking the road skills test for operator's license.

The purpose of the course is to provide behind-the-wheel instruction for beginner drivers. Driving sessions are typically scheduled from 3:00-4:30 pm, with two students paired for each session. Students will drive for a total of 5-6 sessions, and will have the opportunity to take the road skill test with me at the conclusion of the course. They will also receive a certificate of completion for possible insurance discount purposes.

This is a fee-supported course, so there is no credit earned toward graduation. To be eligible, students must already have their learner's permit, and must be currently enrolled in high school courses (no graduates, or older). The course fee is \$175. Spaces are limited, so you must contact me if you are interested so I can add you to my list and answer any questions you may have. Registration will begin in mid January, and this is also when the course fee will be due.
