

Spring Term Dual Enrollment Registration 2021 – 2

New dual enrollment students can register:

- If they have complete common placement test scores on file prior to registration (Reading, Writing, and Math).
Or
- If they have earned college credit for English Composition I and a math class (through AP, AICE, IB, CLEP, etc.).

Continuing dual enrollment students can register:

- If they have complete common placement test scores on file that place them at college-level in Reading, Writing, and Math.
- If they met alternative methods during the period covered by the EO and Addendum that placed them at college-level in Reading, Writing, and Math.
- If they have complete common placement test scores on file that place them at college-level in Reading and Writing, but their Math score is below college-level, provided they have not taken 12 credit hours.

Continuing dual enrollment students must test:

- If they met alternative methods during the period covered by the EO and Addendum that placed them at college-level in Reading and Writing (English Comp I), but **did not meet an alternative method to place in Math** and do not have a math test score.
 - They must provide a math test score prior to registration. This situation is equivalent to them only having tested the Reading and Writing portions of the placement test – under the Articulation Agreements we require all three portions of the test.
- If they have college-level Reading and Writing scores on file, but their Math score is not college-level, and they did not meet an alternative method for math placement, and they have taken 12 credit hours.
 - They must provide a math test score prior to registration.
