



The ASVAB CEP also provides an interest assessment and planning tools to help young adults explore career field entry requirements and various career paths, both military and civilian.



University Admissions

- Need 18 academic credits (Eng. Math, Science, Social Studies, Foreign Lang. 2 academic credits)
- Need 2 years of the SAME Foreign Language
- Need to take SAT and/or ACT
- Test scores and GPA must be competitive





<u>Senior Year College</u> <u>Timeline</u>

Your senior year is when your hard work and planning pay off. Complete college applications in the fall and be aware of deadlines.

■ Aug/Sept- Meet with your counselor/career specialist to discuss your college plans. Go over your ACT and/or SAT scores and determine if you need to retake either of these tests.

Timeline Continued

- October- Complete college admissions and financial aid applications. Be sure to apply to at least one "safety school."
- College Application deadline Nov. 1st!
- Retake the ACT and/or SAT if necessary.
- Complete FAFSA Application online at <u>www.fafsa.gov</u>, opens Oct. 1st.

Timeline Continued

- November- Continue to work on Community Service Hours!
- December Retake the ACT and/or SAT if necessary.
- Jan-March- Seek out and complete local scholarship opportunities. See ZHS College & Career Resource website.
- April Decide which college to attend, return award letters, and if you plan to live on campus, send in your housing deposit.
